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Kia ora from the Principal





Last Wednesday Year 7 children travelled on the bus to Whangamata Area School for their first Food Technology lesson. They discussed safety in the room and how to work effectively in groups. Children were taught how to use a sharp knife correctly before preparing a fruit platter.

Children are finding out about cyclones, floods, tsunamis, earthquakes, volcanoes, tornados and fire. Floods Slips Natural Disasters
Floods are the most common and
widespread of all weather-related natural
disasters. Flooding happens when water
overflows onto land that is normally dry.
This happens during heavy rain, when
ocean waves come on shore, when snow
melts too fast, when dams break or leaves
and trees block drains.


